Psychologist Prescribers

Psychologists in Idaho are being added to the network of doctoral level clinicians ready to support patients with pharmacotherapy. States such as Idaho are currently in need of more clinicians who are able to prescribe and treat patients with a broad spectrum of mental health concerns ranging from depression, anxiety and more complex clinical problems such as schizophrenia and bipolar disorder. The new law allowing for this expansion is complemented by the comprehensive two-year training protocol provided through the Idaho State University (ISU) College of Pharmacy in its new psychopharmacology program. Psychologists completing the training, supervision and qualifications examination are awarded the Master of Science in Clinical Psychopharmacology and are able to add medications to their treatment regimen. Psychologists having received the Master of Science in Clinical Psychopharmacology are credentialed into the Optum Idaho network and can provide medication management services to Medicaid members.

This new program is led by Eric Silk, Ph.D., MSCP and is located on the ISU Meridian campus and supported by on-staff clinical pharmacists, nurse practitioners and consulting physicians. Recent legislative policy governing supervision in training have expanded the medical professionals to physicians in family practice settings. The program is currently working to integrate these physicians into the training. Idaho is the fifth state to allow prescription privileges for psychologists, a provision that has been in place since the late 1980s. The program was developed to provide the necessary training for licensed psychologists to safely and effectively prescribe medication for the treatment of psychological disorders.

Although the recent challenges with COVID-19 mitigation has impacted the year-long roll-out of the new program, Dr. Silk acknowledged that the program has already grown to include the "integrated care" model. This approach will be evident in a new clinic in the Meridian facility that will provide evaluations, psychotherapy and medication management for patients suffering from a variety of mental health conditions requiring medication.

Psychologist Prescribers (cont'd)

ISU's training is designed around a traditional "bricks and mortar" approach that allows students access to state-of-the-art facilities including the Treasure Valley Anatomy and Physiology Laboratories.

Service Update – Drug Testing

The Division of Medicaid and Optum Idaho partnered together to implement updates to the Drug Testing benefit in the IBHP, which will become effective on October 1, 2020. The changes were initially communicated in the March and April editions of IDHW's MedicAide newsletter, with the IBHP application of those changes communicated in a September 1, 2020 provider alert.

The updates to the Drug Testing benefit entail a change in billing code(s) and a change in utilization management. H0003 was removed from the fee schedule and replaced with the following three CPT codes: 80305, 80306, and 80307. Full descriptions of each code are available on the provider fee schedule. Please note that the IBHP does not contract with laboratories, and the IBHP only covers presumptive/qualitative drug tests. Confirmatory/quantitative tests are billed through the member's medical benefit.

In addition to the fee schedule updates, the utilization management of this benefit will change. Optum Idaho will reimburse up to 24 presumptive/qualitative drug tests per calendar year (January through December). These testing limits are inclusive of tests ordered through the IBHP or fee-for-service Medicaid claims reimbursed through Gainwell Technologies, formerly known as DXC. Providers must request prior authorization via Optum's service request process for additional tests beyond the initial 24 units in a calendar year. All drug tests must meet medical necessity criteria. Units utilized prior to October 1, 2020 will not count toward the threshold amount for the 2020 calendar year.

This policy does not apply to drug tests administered as part of a program billed as a bundle in the IBHP such as Intensive Outpatient, Partial Hospitalization or Opioid Treatment Programs (to be implemented January 1, 2021). Drug tests administered in these programs are included in the bundled rate.

Telehealth

Optum Idaho Telehealth Policy: Enhancing Access to Services for Idaho Medicaid Members

As shelter-in-place orders were instituted in response to the coronavirus pandemic, utilization of telehealth became critical for patients to engage in health care services. In response to the need to create access to services, federal and state regulators lifted many telehealth restrictions to support providers as they adjusted to this new demand for services. During this stressful time, behavioral health services are more important than ever to our members. We followed suit to facilitate access for members and relieve any uncertainty for providers.

Optum Idaho is grateful to providers for responding quickly and moving into territory that may have felt unfamiliar initially but has allowed members to receive on-going services. This time has provided an opportunity for both providers and members to learn the benefits of utilizing telehealth and has expanded access to vital services for members that have challenges due to transportation, scheduling, childcare or a behavioral health condition that makes in-person counseling at an office not preferable.

Utilization of Telehealth by Idaho Medicaid Members

At the peak of the shelter-in-place, over 1,200 providers offered telehealth services to 19,500 members in April. Medication management, psychotherapy, substance use disorder services as well as skills building/CBRS and peer and family support services were provided by video platforms. In addition, many more members received similar services by telephonic delivery as the video requirement was relaxed for COVID-19. Though the demand has reduced somewhat as members have adjusted to the pandemic conditions and identified ways to safely return to inperson services, thousands of members in Idaho continue to rely on virtual visit technology to meet their behavioral health needs



In the short term, Optum Idaho will maintain current COVID-19 measures that allow telehealth or telephonic services to be utilized by all levels of professionals and all allowed services until the pandemic risks are alleviated. Optum will provide at least thirty days' notice to provider when updates to requirements for services delivered via telehealth or telephone are made to ensure that providers have ample time to work with members on how services are delivered.

Submit Attestations

As you are aware, Optum Idaho temporarily removed the requirement to submit a Telehealth Attestation as we all moved quickly to provide services remotely. In order to be listed in the Optum Idaho Network of telehealth providers and ensure the modality is listed in the member search tool under your agency, it is necessary for providers to submit the required attestation form.

Individual clinicians can complete the Attestation Form online. Group agencies who wish to complete the attestation should reach out to their Provider Relations Advocate to receive the Group Agency Attestation.

Are You a Targeted Care Coordinator Who is Ready to Enhance Your Skills in Care Coordination?


