Dear Provider:

Optum Idaho is implementing a new fee schedule to allow integrated medical clinics to provide brief behavioral health interventions to their patients. Reimbursement of the Health and Behavior Assessment and Intervention (HBAI) Codes will allow an integrated approach to providing behavioral health and medical services to Idaho Medicaid members. The new fee schedule is available May 15, 2018 to full service ambulatory clinics who provide medical services in their communities.

The new fee schedule includes HBAI Codes :

<b>CPT Code</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>96150</b>	Health and behavior assessment (e.g., health-focused clinical interview, behavioral observations, psychophysiological monitoring, health-oriented questionnaires), each 15 minutes face-to-face with the patient; initial assessment
<b>96151</b>	Health and behavior assessment (e.g., health-focused clinical interview, behavioral observations, psychophysiological monitoring, health-oriented questionnaires), each 15 minutes face-to-face with the patient; re-assessment
<b>96152</b>	Health and behavior intervention, each 15 minutes, face-to-face; individual
<b>96153</b>	Health and behavior intervention, each 15 minutes, face-to-face; group (2 or more patients)
<b>96154</b>	Health and behavior intervention, each 15 minutes, face-to-face; family (with the patient present)
