Alert Summary: This alert details the enhancement to the Youth Support endorsement, which will be effective with the next training opportunity in April. It also includes reminders of Quality of Care and Supervisor trainings.

Dear Provider,

Peer Services – Peer Support, Youth Support, Family Support and Recovery Coaching – continue increasing in importance for the recovery and resiliency of many members. We strongly encourage both providers and supervisors of these services to take advantage of the classes below to stay informed and better serve our members.

YOUTH SUPPORT ENHANCED TRAINING

We are excited to announce that we have enhanced the Youth Support (YS) endorsement training based on your feedback. Beginning with the next session, we are offering an enhanced model in which 100% of the curriculum will be taught in a live, virtual environment.

The next training opportunity is scheduled for April 12-15, 2022, 9 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. MT (with a 30-minute lunch break). Participants need to attend all four days plus a required one-hour technology check on April 6, 2022, at either 9:30 a.m. or 4:30 p.m. MT.

If you are interested in providing this service, and you meet the required qualifications listed below, we encourage you to participate, as you must have your YS endorsement to render this service to members. As a reminder, a YS provider must have an existing Peer Support Certification. YS endorsement is Optum Idaho-issued and only valid within Idaho Medicaid.

Provider Qualifications:

1. Minimum of a high school diploma (or equivalent)
2. Current Idaho Peer Support Specialist Certification: <https://www.bpahealth.com/idaho-peer-cert/>
3. Lived experience with serious emotional disturbance (SED) or SED co-occurring with substance use disorder (SUD) as a youth or adolescent (standalone SUD lived experience is not eligible)
4. Recovery for a minimum of one year
5. Successfully passing a screening process
6. It is recommended that providers of this service are between the ages 21-30 and have a strong personal connection to current youth culture to connect with youth on a peer-to-peer level based on shared knowledge and experience

Endorsement:

The Optum Idaho YS endorsement is granted upon completion of all the following:

1. Obtain and maintain an Idaho Peer Support Specialist Certification, which must be current and valid prior to enrolling in online training
2. Complete this enrollment form
3. Complete screening interview with YS Trainer: Providers must successfully pass the screening interview
4. Full attendance at a live webinar training over a four-day period
5. After full completion, provider logs into Relias to print their endorsement certificate

The cost of training supplies and materials is \$50 per person for providers who successfully pass the applicant screening process (the remaining cost of training is covered by Optum). Instructions for payment to the Idaho Federation of Families will be provided upon acceptance into the YS endorsement training. The deadline to submit an enrollment application is March 24, 2022, and the final round of phone interviews will take place by March 25, 2022.

The online modules that were previously part of the Youth Support endorsement are still available in Relias but are no longer required as of April 2022. They can still be found by clicking on Course Library and searching for Optum Idaho Youth Support NEW (933961) and enrolling.

This training was designed to assist supervisors of all Peer Services to ensure they are as knowledgeable of best practices as those they oversee. Topics covered include:

- Similarities and differences of the roles of Peer Support, Youth Support, Family Support and Recovery Coaching
- Appropriate referrals for Peer Services
- Essential supervisory skills, functions and challenges
- Agency readiness for Peer Services

This course is available on demand in Relias, which takes approximately two hours to complete, and provides two Continuing Education Units (CEUs). To access the course:
